DUAH CAMPBELL AFRICA *Fellowship*

The Duah Campbell "Turning Back, Paying Forward" Fellowship to Ghana, created by the 49th Student Government Association President Yania Campbell and the 2nd Executive Vice President Aaliyah Duah, seeks to take Virginia State University Students on a 7 day fellowship to Ghana, West Africa for an experiential learning opportunity at almost no cost to the students. The Inaugural Fellowship will take place from June 12-19, 2023. In Ghana, they will engage with Ghanaian culture, learn about the Atlantic Slave Trade, Ghana's universities, including Presbyterian Trinity, and gain deep insights into their ancestry. Students will be able to reflect on their roots and work together on campus to raise awareness of their roots at the end of this journey.

Current Issues

- The HVAC system in Quads II and Foster is not working
- Washers and dryers in the Residence halls are consistently down and have not been repaired by maintenance
- There is a lack of parking on campus inviting students to park in restricted areas to be fined
- There have been frequent WiFi outages in the residence halls and inconsistent service across campus
- Students are having difficulties getting in contact with their Advisors to meet for academic/graduation concerns
- There have been several tense interactions between VSU Police and students
- The dining hall hours are no longer extended and are closing earlier than the previously agreed upon time

Current Initiatives

- Collaborated with President Abdullah's office and the International Education department to start an annual study abroad experience to Ghana, West Africa for students
- Working with Administration to implement a bill for student organizational funding
- Our Administration is currently conducting the second SGA Week April 17th - 21st
- Working on raising money for the Spring 2023 Endowment
- Our Administration is working towards having a shuttle bus to Wawa and Cookout
- We are currently advocating for dual enrollment programs in high schools to provide students VSU classes in Brooklyn, New York
- Our Administration is currently working towards opening a photo studio for students and photographers on campus
- Our Administration advocated to make aesthetic additions to the campus by wrapping the elevators with VSU colors and logos
- Our administration advocated for a new bench on the yard for students that are not apart of Greek organizations to still feel included
- The Administration was able to hold elections for the 2023-2024 Academic School year and
