#### WELCOME

Rector Branch welcomed attendees to the second day of the Board of Visitors (BOV) orientation and retreat, expressing appreciation for their continued engagement. He reiterated the goals of the retreat, emphasizing the importance of collaboration, strategic planning, and alignment with institutional priorities. The orientation continues to serve as a platform for familiarizing new members with university governance, policies, and initiatives.

Rector Branch also provided a brief historical overview of the museum hosting the retreat, highlighting its significance in preserving Virginia's cultural and historical heritage. His remarks underscored the venue's alignment with Virginia State University's mission to honor the past while planning for the future.

#### PRESENTATION: VSU Strategic Plan, 2025-2028 "Greater by Design"

Dr. Tia A. Minnis gave a brief presentation of Virginia State University's Strategic Plan: The university has officially launched its new strategic plan titled Greater by Design, a bold and intentional three-year roadmap that builds upon the momentum of the previous five-year plan, Preeminence with Purpose. This new plan continues to focus on advancing the institution's mission and vision, with artificial intelligence (AI) playing a central role in driving innovation, academic excellence, and operational agility.

Key highlights of the plan include:

- Priority 1: Advancing Student Success
  - Leveraging AI to enhance student support and educational outcomes.
- Priority 2: Institutional Effectiveness
  Strengthening operations, fundraising, and financial stability through digital transformation and AI integration.
- Priority 3: Academic Excellence and Mission Advancement Investing in faculty and staff to ensure alignment with the university's mission and support academic innovation.
- Priority 4: Visibility and Impact
  - Expanding the university's brand and community engagement, emphasizing its role as a land-grant institution.

The plan reaffirms the university's mission and vision, with core values such as student-centeredness, excellence, and transformative teaching guiding strategic decisions. The full details of goals and priorities are included in the distributed materials.

Dr. Alexis Brooks-Walter provided an overview of Virginia State University's Six-Year Plan (2025), outlining the university's long-term strategic goals and initiatives. The plan aligns with institutional priorities and state-level expectations, focusing on enhancing student success, academic excellence, financial sustainability, and community engagement. It serves as a framework for guiding decision-making, resource allocation, and continuous improvement across the university.
