Graduation rates are measured in much the same way as retention rates; i.e., they follow a cohort of first-time, full-time freshman who graduate in four-years (or less), five years, and six years. The six-year rate is used for federal reporting because federal financial aid eligibility (12 semesters) is 150% of the time normally needed to complete a bachelor's degree (four years). VSU's current graduation rate is 36%.

Retention Rate

Retention rates are measured by cohorts comprised of a specific group of first-time, full-time freshmen who enter in a given year (fall semester), complete that year, and return to the same institution for a second year. The retention rate is calculated as a percentage of the group that originally matriculated. VSU's retention rate 73%.

Mental Health is Everybody's Business

- Historically, after traumatic events there has been an "After Effect"
- According to a recent survey conducted by BestColleges.com over 90% of college students have experienced negative mental health symptoms due to the pandemic, where nearly half expressed struggles with isolation, anxiety, and a lack of focus.
- Shift from Mitigating the physical impact of COVID-19 to strengthening the overall "Quality of Care"


