




- The Honors College was selected as a partner institution in a 3-year \$750,000 United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) grant named "The Justice Challenge".

Admission (VSU Catalog 2023-2024)

• Virginia State University is committed to admit students who possess a diverse range of talents and abilities. Students who are applying for admission as first-time freshmen are expected to have completed a college-preparatory program in high school.



Admission

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- Admission Requirements
 - Minimum 2.2 GPA on 4.00 scale
 - Three (3) units of mathematics(Algebra I and higher)
 - Four (4) units of English
 - Two (2) units of Science (1 laboratory science; i.e. Biology, Chemistry or Physics)
 - Two (2) units of Social Studies (History, Government, Civics, Geography)
 - Two (2) units of Foreign Language are recommended (not required)
- Freshman students applying to traditional admission must submit the following:
 - An online application
 - High school of GED transcript
 - SAT and/or ACT scores (optional)
- A student who does not meet a component of the entrance requirement (e.g., a student's GPA is between 2.0 2.19), may be admitted on a "conditional" basis.





Student and Faculty/Staff Population

Estimated student population - 5,200. The VSU Police Department's current employment number for sworn police officers is 23. The ratio is one officer per 226 students.

Estimated student, faculty, and staff population - 6,471. The ratio for the total population is one officer per 281 students, faculty, and staff.

The above ratio does not reflect guests/visitors, students from other universities and contractors

Fort Gregg-Adams Military Base:

- Two military veterans are currently in the background phase for employment as VSU Security Officers



Security Measures On-Campus

- Increased foot, vehicle, and bike patrols by VSU Police
- Each Residence Hall is staffed with RMC security staff
- Two additional RMC security assigned to Quad I and II
- Use of Deterrent Police Vehicles (housing modulars)

- Deployed six portable camera trailer systems
- Deployed ten new portable light towers
- Provided brochures and pamphlets that contain safety tips, emergency phone numbers, and available resources
- Purchased 4 electronic messaging boards
- 5 new handheld devices for the Ticketrack System are in use





Security Measures Off-Campus

- Increased foot and vehicle patrols by VSU Police and Top Guard Security at UAE and other off-campus housing (hotels in Chesterfield County and Colonial Heights)
- Petersburg Police Department agreed to conduct extra patrols at Addison Apartments and Market Place Apartments. Richard Bland College Police Department will ensure VSU student's safety and will contact VSU Police with incidents involving VSU students
- Each hotel is staffed with a Top Guard Security Officer
- Provided brochures and pamphlets that contain safety tips, emergency phone numbers, and available resources
- Weekly meetings with Chesterfield, Colonial Heights, and Petersburg Police Departments
- Student safety briefings about on and off-campus safety

Outside Law Enforcement Agencies Support

- Chesterfield Police and Sheriff's Departments assists with multiple events, criminal investigations, student safety briefings, and panel discussions on campus throughout the year
- Petersburg Police Department and Colonial Heights Police Department assist with training, events security, and criminal investigations
- The Chesterfield Police Department, Chesterfield Sheriff's Department, Petersburg Police Department, and Colonial Heights Police Departments have agreed to contact the VSU Police Department for any incidents involving VSU students.
- Virginia State Police assist with event security, K-9 searches, and training
