#### Morocco

Tavon Massenburg (Information Systems major) and Brooke McClinton (Information Systems major) participated in a study-abroad visit this summer to Morocco. Brooke said of the experience, "During this life-changing program, I collaborated with a vibrant group on classroom planning and teaching in local schools in Tikhfist and Ourzazate. Together, we explored the themes of water and culture by having discussions with two local NGOs, visiting Marrakech's Water Museum, touring the landscapes, and more. Individually, I observed Morocco's CO2 emissions and gender and income inequality, revealing environmental challenges alongside the social and infrastructural strides. I could not possibly fit all of my observations and lessons into one post, so I will simply start by thanking Professor Anne-Marie Turnage, Rajae Bougaze, Dean Daniel Roberts, and the Institute for Leadership and Communication Studies for facilitating this trip. You all made this experience special. Finally, I want to acknowledge how deeply inspired I am by the incredibly dedicated, graceful, hospitable individuals we met in Morocco. From the children we exchanged nursery rhymes and dances with to the community leaders and guides we spoke with, I learned so much about Moroccan culture and following the true values of family and faith. For that, I am forever grateful."



# Scholarships


