Dear Prospective Vendor:

Virginia State University will be hosting their annual Homecoming festivities on Friday October 24, 2025 and Saturday October 25, 2025. On Friday, October 24, 2025 the Vendor Bazaar starts at 12:00 pm until 6:00 pm and Saturday, October 25, 2025 9:00 am to 7:30 pm. We invite you to participate in one of the largest events in the Tri-Cities yielding over 30,000 attendees over the course of two days.

Vending will occur on the band's practice field, located next to Daniel Gymnasium (see attached map), and space is assigned based on the order applications are received (submit your application early). Adhering to your assigned location and set up time is required. Vendors will be allowed to set up during the said hours below. Inspection by Health Department, State Fire Marshal, and Campus Safety Officer is required before operation to confirm compliancy.

Food vendors must complete a Temporary Food Event Permit given by the Chesterfield Environmental Health Office and pay an additional \$40 to Chesterfield County. Food vendors may contact Ms. Arlene Greene-Isaac, Environmental Health Specialist 200 Highland Ave, Colonial Heights VA 23834. The vendor application, the appropriate vendor fee and if applicable, a copy of the Temporary Food Permit are due by 5:00 p.m. Monday October 13, 2025 vdh.virginia.gov/chesterfield/environmental-health/food-program/ or https://www.vdh,virginia.gov (go to food program) look for the green box labeled Temporary Food Establishment If you are unable to contact Ms. Greene Isaac call (804) 748-1610 to speak to the supervisor or person on duty for information.

No vendor applications/fees will be accepted after this date. Once all spots are filled we will not accept any more applications/fees.

All confirmed vendors will receive a parking pass to display in their vehicle (2 vehicle limit) and their assigned space. No vehicles are allowed to be parked on Daniels Field, they must be parked in Daniels lot or other designated lots for parking.

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VENDORS' BAZAAR RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. All vendors are subject to close inspection by the Virginia State University Department of Police and Public Safety.
- 2. Virginia State University reserves the right to deny a vendor's application
- 3. Authorized vending is to take place on the **Band Field ONLY/Daniels Practice Field**. Vending outside of this area is prohibited.
- 4. The sale of Virginia State University paraphernalia is prohibited *unless* you obtain a license. For further information concerning licensing policies, contact the VSU Purchasing Office at 804-524-5115. *Any paraphernalia that is not properly licensed will be confiscated.*
- 5. The University **WILL NOT** provide tables, chairs, or electrical outlets.
- 6. Vendors are prohibited from playing loud and/or obscene music. Noncompliance may cause dismissal.
- 7. All Food vendors are required to complete a temporary food event permit and adhere to all rules and regulations governing food preparation.
- 8. Any damage to exiting utilities, equipment, grounds equipment and/or finished surfaces resulting from the performance of this agreement shall be repaired to the Commonwealth's satisfaction at the contractor's expense.
- 9. Vendors must bring their own large non-combustible trash cans for all cooking areas.
- 10. Dumpsters will be provided by the University and will be placed in designated areas for your use.
- 11. Vendors should park loading vehicles only in Lot 26 and smaller vehicles in Lot 25 reserved for vendors. No parking of vehicles on the grass or curbs to allow for emergency response vehicle excess.

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- 12. All vendor fees are due no later than **October 13th, 2025**. Vendors may pay via mail with a cashier's check, money order, or by calling 804-524-5150 to pay by credit card (MasterCard, Visa or American Express).
- 13. Food vendors must have the proper fire-extinguishing equipment required by their business permit of operation and be familiar with fire regulation procedures. All mobile food preparation vehicles are required to submit their paperwork to the Virginia Department of Fire Programs State Fire Marshal's Office for operation on State Property. Your must have proof of inspection from the **Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ)**
- 14. Precautions must be taken for the storage and use of flammable materials; using surge protectors, electrical circuits and appliances; and ensuring passageways near and around concession areas remain open and uncluttered at all times.
- 15. No refunds are granted, unless the event is cancelled.
- 16. Rain or Shine. The bazaar will take place unless there is severe lightning or conditions out of the event staff's control. Tents meet Virginia Construction Code (See attached)
- 17. Tents will not be in excess of a **twenty-foot front**. Vending outside of this area is prohibited. Respect for other vendors area is utmost. **All open flame operations shall be located 20 feet away from tent structure. Food required to be protected by overhead cover shall be done with the use of a canopy that is labeled as fire retardant and constructed not to allow open flame devices to affect the structure.**
- 18. The Virginia State University trademark licensing program gives the University control over its logos and marks, thus ensuring the quality and consistency of all uses and merchandise. Anyone wishing to use the University seal and logos of VSU must obtain a license. A Single School Retail license permits vendors to sell to retailers or directly to consumers any Virginia State University merchandise. Only licensed vendors are permitted to sell VSU merchandise at VSU events. Please CLICK HERE FOR LICENSING INFORMATION.

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Mobile Food Preparation Vehicle Contract and Forms

The Virginia State Fire Marshal's Office is committed to providing safety for residents and occupants from fire and to maintain fire code compliance for all that live, work, and visit Virginia. Within that commitment, the SFMO is responsible for the inspection and permitting of mobile food preparation vehicles operating in Virginia.

2021 Virginia Statewide Fire Prevention Code

319.1 General.

Mobile food preparation vehicles that are equipped with appliances that utilize open flames or produce smoke or grease laden vapors shall comply with this section.

319.1.1 Wheel chocks.

Wheel chocks shall be used to prevent mobile food preparation vehicles from moving.

319.1.2 Separation.

Mobile food preparation vehicles shall be separated from buildings or structures, combustible materials, vehicles, and other cooking operations by a minimum of $\frac{10 \text{ feet } (3 \text{ m})}{10 \text{ feet } (3 \text{ m})}$.

319.2 Permit required. Permits shall be required as set forth in Section 107.2.

319.2.1 Permit Authority Having Jurisdiction (AHJ).

The enforcing agent of a permit requirement on a mobile food preparation vehicle (MFPV) shall be the appointed fire official for the Virginia local government which the food truck is identified for personal property tax payment of the vehicle. If no such entity exists, if the local government has elected to not enforce this section of the SFPC, or if the MFPV is housed out of state, then it shall be the State Fire Marshal's Office (SFMO) or designee.

Fee Notification

The SFMO will only be inspecting and permitting mobile food preparation vehicles in those localities where the SFMO is the Authority Having Jurisdiction (or if the local government has elected to not enforce this section of the SFPC) as indicated in the above reference code section (319.2.1).

SFMO will charge a flat rate for services and inspections, report preparations, and managerial review. The rate will be a \$200.00 annual charge for inspection and services rendered during the Mobile Food Preparation Vehicle inspection.

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VIRGINIA CONSTRUCTION CODE


3103.9 Anchorage required. Tents or membrane structures and their appurtenances shall be adequately roped, braced and anchored to withstand the elements of weather and prevent against collapsing. Documentation of structural stability shall be furnished to the fire code official upon request.

- 3104.3 Label. Membrane structures or tents shall have a permanently affixed label bearing the identification of size and fabric or material type.
- 3104.4 Certification. An affidavit or affirmation shall be submitted to the fire code official and a copy retained on premises on which the tent or air- supported structure is located. The affidavit shall attest to the following information relative to the flame propagation performance of the fabric.
 - 1. Names and addresses of the owners of the tent or air-supported structure
 - 2. Date the fabric was last treated with flame-retardant solution.
 - 3. Trade name or kind of chemical used.
 - 4. Name of person or firm treating the material.
 - 5. Name of testing agency and test standard by which the fabric was tested.
 - 6. Tents **MUST HAVE** label claiming they fire-retardant.
- 3104.7 Open or exposed flame. Open flame or other devices emitting flame, fire or heat or any flammable or combustible liquids, gas, charcoal or other cooking device or any other unapproved devices shall not be permitted inside or located within 20 feet of the tent or membrane structures while open to the public <u>unless</u> approve by the fire code official.

904.11.5 Portable fire extinguishers for commercial cooking equipment. Portable fire extinguishers shall be provided within a 30-foot travel distance of commercial-type cooking equipment. Cooking equipment involving vegetable or animal oils and fats shall be protected by a Class K rated portable extinguisher.

All codes are from the 2021 Statewide Fire Prevention Code. The Safety Office can be reached at (804) 524- 5222 for questions concerning the codes.

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SATELLITE PARKING

Ettrick Elementary School Parking Lot

From 1-95

Follow I-95 South to Petersburg. Take Temple Avenue exit (54). Turn left at Temple Avenue and continue to second traffic light (Boulevard). Turn left at Boulevard and continue to fourth traffic light (Dupuy Road). Turn right at Dupuy Road which changes to River Road. The campus will be on your left. Continue on River Road until you come to a traffic light. Make a left at the traffic light. Ettrick Elementary School will be on your right. Make a right on Paine Street and the parking lot will be on your right, behind the school.

From Petersburg/N. Sycamore Street

Follow Sycamore Street, northbound, and continue to end of street (Old Street). Turn left at Old Street (changes to Grove Avenue) and continue on Grove Avenue to Fleet Street. Turn right at Fleet Street and cross Appomattox River Bridge. VSU will be on your right. Continue (on Chesterfield Avenue) and make a left turn on Paine Street, which is beside Ettrick Elementary School. The parking lot will be on your right, behind the school.
